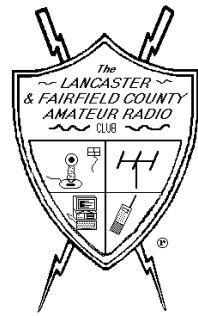

CODE PROFICIENCY PROGRAM

TOM MOORE, KB8USK

Evaluate your Morse code ability through the ARRL Code Proficiency program. Copy one of the W1AW's twice monthly qualifying runs (sent at speeds from 10-40 WPM on virtually all bands--see W1AW schedule), and submit 1 solid minute of solid copy and a SASE (9 x 12 with 2 oz. U.S. Postage for certificate, small for endorsement) to HQ.

Your submission will be checked directly against the official W1AW text, and if you pass, you'll get your initial code proficiency certificate. From then on, endorsement stickers are issued for speeds up to 40 WPM. Non-hams and hams alike are eligible for the Code Proficiency program.



MIR, SK (Mar 23, 2001) -- Take off your steel hardhats and protective tinfoil beanies. The Russian *MIR* space station was brought down early today--apparently safely and according to plan. The only thing that got pelted with space debris was the Pacific Ocean. Over its 15 years, *MIR* housed Amateur Radio gear and hosted several Amateur Radio operators as crew members, who often used the R0MIR call sign.



Skipper Critical after Pirate Shooting; Trinidad Ham Provides New Details

(Mar 26, 2001) -- The Swedish skipper of a sailboat, who was shot after pirates boarded his vessel March 20 off the coast of Venezuela, remains hospitalized in Trinidad. The victim has been identified as Bo Altheden, SM7XBH, of Bjärred, Sweden. Hams on the Maritime Mobile Service Net assisted Altheden and his wife, ViVi-Maj Miren, when Miren put out a call for help on 20 meters after her husband was shot once in the abdomen.



Europe Adopts 5 WPM as Morse Code Standard (Mar 21, 2001) -- The Conference of Postal and Telecommunications Administrations--CEPT--has effectively lowered the Amateur Radio Morse code test speed to 5 WPM for all European countries. The CEPT Radio Regulatory Working Group (WGRR), meeting last month in The Hague, adopted a revision of Recommendation 61-02 to include the 5 WPM standard.

STATION OPERATION AND THE LAW

Occasionally, we need to be reminded of our responsibilities as amateur radio operators to uphold the laws that we learned, tested, and guaranteed with our signatures on the license we received in the mail from the FCC. A few of the regulations from the FCC Rule Book can be sighted to refresh our memories and to make sure that we protect ourselves, the club, and the trustees from receiving unwanted notices from Riley Hollingsworth.

Sec. 97.5 Station license required. (a) When a station is transmitting, the person having physical control of the apparatus must hold an FCC-issued written authorization for an amateur station.

Sec. 97.101 General standards. (d) No amateur operator shall willfully or maliciously interfere with or cause interference to any radio communication or signal.

Sec. 97.103 Station license responsibilities. (a) The station licensee is responsible for the proper operation of the station in accordance with the FCC Rules.

Sec. 97.105 Control operator duties. (a) The control operator must ensure the immediate proper operation of the station, regardless of the type of control.

Sec. 97.113 Prohibited transmissions. (a) No amateur station shall transmit: (4) Music using a phone emission except (e) ...incidental music, originating ... between a space shuttle and its associated Earth stations); communications intended to facilitate a criminal act; messages in codes or ciphers intended to obscure the meaning thereof, except as otherwise provided herein (see (e) insert above); obscene or indecent words or language; or false or deceptive messages, signals or identification.

Sec. 97.119 Station identification. (a) Each amateur station, except a space station or tele-command station, must transmit its assigned call sign on its transmitting channel at the end of each communication, and at least every ten minutes during a communication, for the purpose of clearly making the source of the transmissions from the station known to those receiving the transmissions from the station known to those receiving the transmissions. No station may transmit, any call sign not authorized to the station.

As we can see the Rules are quite clear as to the responsibilities of each of us as amateur radio operators. Lets preserve our hobby and the rights we have and enjoy, by following these rules, promoting them regularly, and policing our air waves as needed.

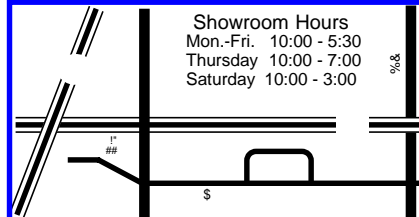

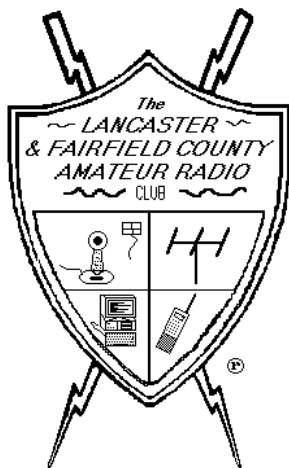
