Hi,

I sent out a note two weeks ago regarding the annual ARES Ohio meeting in April. So far, only one person responded, just to wish me good luck. Larry Rain, WD8IHP, is the Ohio SEC and is anxious to get statewide packet operations in place, to serve as an error free communications mode for emergency operations. The goal is to provide access to the state EMA, to and from all counties, and to provide redundant paths in case of power outages. Larry has done great work in order to get EC and DEC appointments within the state, and most of the counties are currently assigned.

However, just getting the county EC's to get on the air with a packet station will not provide the real solution. As I see it, and I may be all wet, is to create a strong network of high profile stations, all with high speed ports that can link with each other. They will also have local connect ports, yes, at 1200 baud, so as to permit as many individual connects as possible. These sites preferably should be maintained by clubs or groups, not individuals, so that continuity can be preserved. These stations should be set up so that individuals over the state can reach at least one of them in order to access the network, and then digi over the state, and beyond.

Most packet individuals started with, and still have 1200 baud 2 meter equipment, which would be fine for accessing a base site. As more and more hams get faster and better equipment, connections should be available for them to use that as well. I do not see just going directly to 9600 or higher just now, as most folks will find the cost prohibitive. However, maybe someone like yourself knows of other ways to achieve this goal. by using used commercial gear and converting to our bands. By helping a large number of folks to go this route would help standardize the equipment, probably induce folks to have dedicated packet radios, and do it at a reasonable cost.

As more individual radios appear with higher speed capability, we could add ports at the base sites to accommodate the hams who wish to upgrade. Ultimately, 1200 baud stuff might fade away, but not for a while. As to specific equipment, frequencies, and site locations, I just have to ask for help in proposing a plan. Maybe with the EC's all getting interested in their own counties, some of these questions will get answers. Hoever, I would rather see a civilian network being the main system, with emergency needs using it, rather than the other way around. If a lot of folks find that packet is there, they will use it daily. If the network only comes up when an emergency is called, no one will want to invest.

Please give me your thoughts, suggestions, or whatever. It is still not too late to make a pitch at the April 26th meeting.
